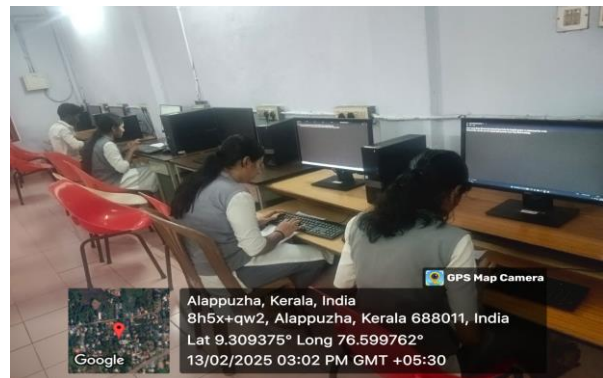
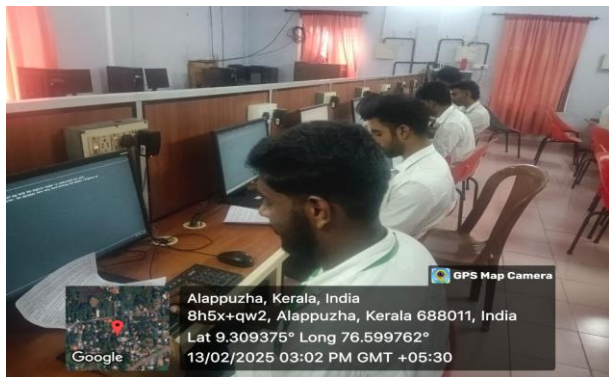

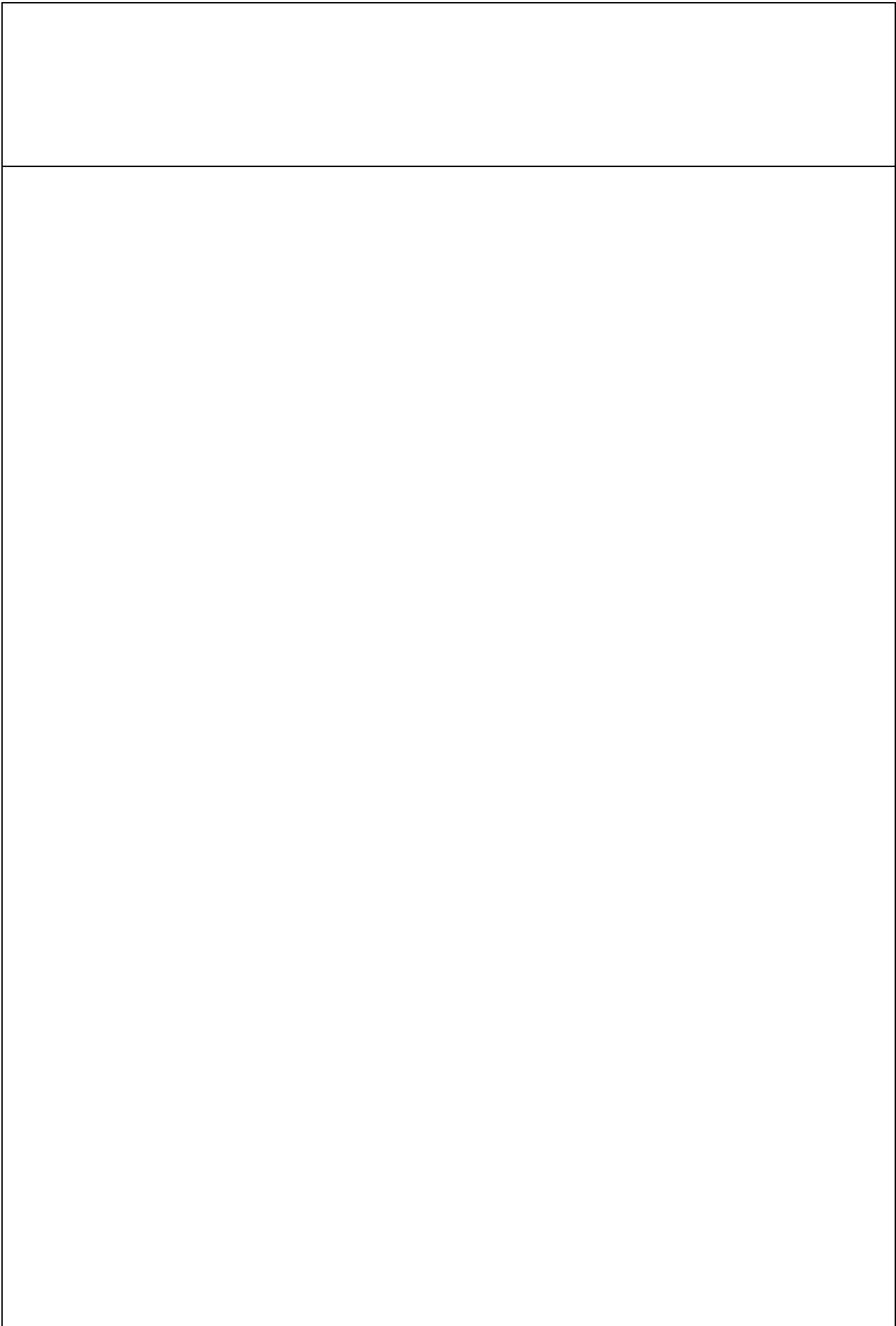

REPORT OF THE EVENT

An orientation class on NAAC Accreditation was organized on 20/03/2025, Thursday at 2.00 pm at College of Applied Science, Preissery, with the primary objective of sensitizing faculty members, about the significance of the accreditation process conducted by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The session aimed to provide a comprehensive understanding of the Revised Accreditation Framework (RAF), which focuses on quality improvement and accountability in higher education institutions. A team of faculties, who are in charge of NAAC accreditation works, from College of Applied Science, Mavelikkara, experts in quality assurance and accreditation processes, gave an in-depth presentation on the core values and functions of NAAC, elaborating on the importance of institutional accreditation in ensuring academic excellence, transparency, and continuous development.

During the session, various critical aspects of the accreditation process were discussed in detail. These included an overview of the seven criteria used for assessment—namely, Curricular Aspects, Teaching-Learning and Evaluation, Research and Innovation, Infrastructure and Learning Resources, Student Support and Progression, Governance and Leadership, and Institutional Values and Best Practices. Special emphasis was placed on understanding key indicators, both qualitative and quantitative, and how to systematically gather and present evidence to support the Self-Study Report (SSR). The role of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) was highlighted as a central mechanism in planning, monitoring, and documenting quality initiatives within the institution.

The participants, actively engaged in the session by raising questions and sharing their experiences. The team also addressed the challenges commonly faced during the data validation and verification (DVV) process and shared best practices for effective preparation before the NAAC peer team visit. Strategies for preparing Annual Quality Assurance Reports (AQAR), enhancing student involvement, and initiating post-accreditation quality enhancement measures were also discussed.

The orientation session proved to be extremely beneficial in creating awareness about the structured approach required for NAAC accreditation. It helped the institution in recognizing the areas that need focused attention and encouraged a culture of continuous quality improvement. Overall, the session laid a strong foundation for the institution's future efforts toward achieving accreditation and maintaining high standards in higher education.



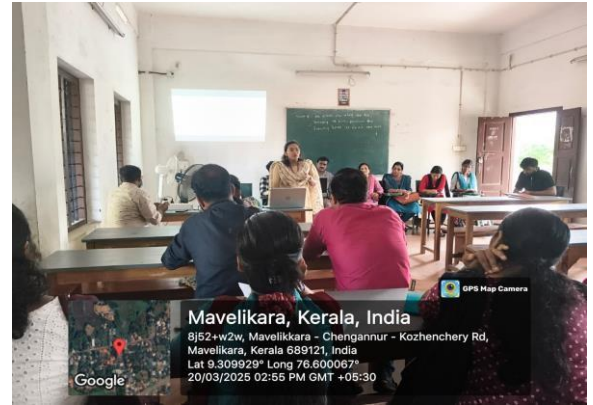
